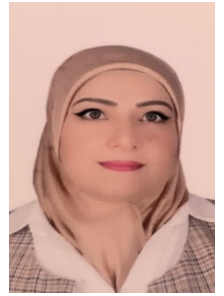

Project: The Paediatric version (VOICES-C) of the Views of Informal Carers Evaluation Survey-Short Form (VOICES-SF): Views of Health Professionals and pilot-testing with bereaved parents in Jordan
